Edward Abersol Attorney...

Class of 1890

Edward Abersol was born March 21, 1873 to John and Catherine Belsley Abersol, who had immigrated in 1871 from Loraine, France and Nancy, France. Their first child, Mary, was born in France. Edward was born in Metamora.

John purchased land and a gun shop that stood on the northwest corner of Menard and Partridge. He then moved the gun shop to the lot next door, living upstairs with the gun shop downstairs. The logs used to move the building are still in use today as the ceiling in the dirt basement.

Edward was in the seventh graduating class of Metamora High School. The ceremony was held at the Court House on Friday, May 9, 1890. The class was comprised of 4 young men and 2 young ladies. Each student gave an oration before the diplomas were presented.

Upon graduation, Edward attended the University of Michigan, where he studied law. Mary was willed the store and ran it with her husband, John Isch.

Upon graduation, Edward moved to Peoria where he practiced law for 34 years. His office was in the old YMCA building in the 100 block of North Jefferson located on the third floor. He never married.

After a regular routine Sunday walk on May 5, 1935, Edward was found dead in the restroom of the Pere Marquette Hotel, having suffered a fatal heart attack. He was 62 years old. He is buried in Oakwood Cemetery.

Pictured above are all that remain of Edward's possessions – his vest and top coat. The cape belonged to Mary Isch. The first picture is Edward as an adult, next is his high school graduation picture. His old law books were stored in the basement of the Abersol home, but ruined by many years of seeping water.
